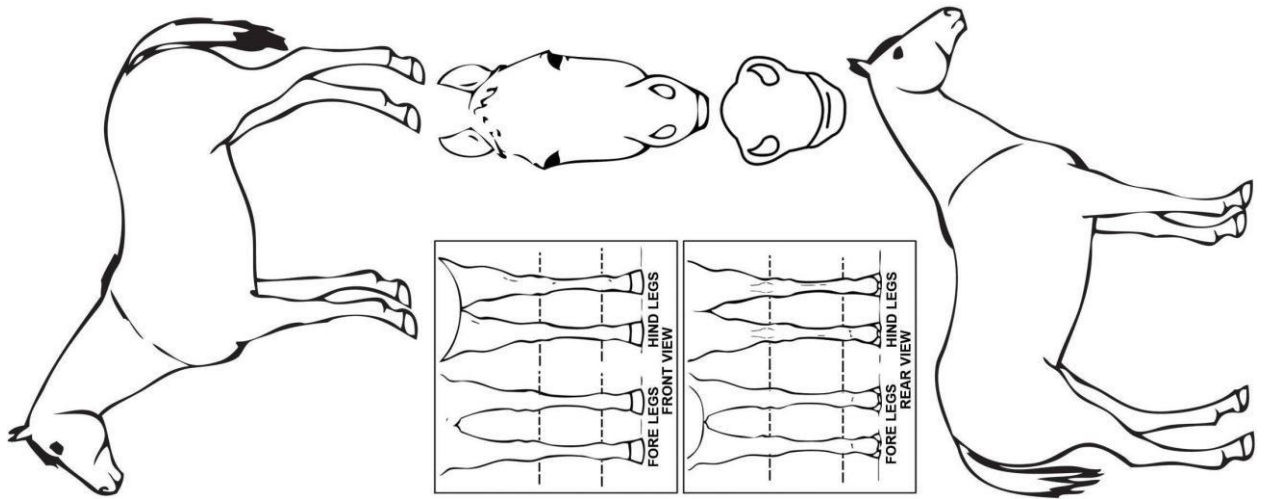

PHOTOGRAPHS

A guideline for submitting photographs.

If you have any queries please do not hesitate to give us a call 02 6762 6444

1. We require 4 clear, colour, unobstructed photographs of your horse.

- a) One full length of the front of the horse
- b) One full length of the back of the horse
- c) Full shot of horses offside
- d) Full shot of horses nearside

NB: Please make sure all white markings, brands and whorls are visible in the photograph

2. Acceptable format for photographs;

- a) Colour prints (preferred)
- b) Colour photos by email are acceptable if photos are clearly identified. JPGS but must be of a reasonable resolution

3. When sending the photos please label them with your membership number and the name of the horse (via email include details)

4. Send the most recent photos of the horse, certainly no older than 6 months

5. A few tips:

- a) Have someone help you by holding the horse
- b) Check your focus
- c) Preferable to use natural light
- d) Fit the whole horse into your lens
- e) Take the shot as close as possible without losing heads or feet, use zoom if necessary

6. Please note that the photographs you send to us will be kept on record with the horses' other relevant paperwork.
