BREAKIN HEARTS foaled on 15th August, 1995 at Bredbo, NSW.

In 1997 she was purchased by Amanda Box of Melbourne and from 1998 until 2002 she was trained and shown by David Norbury, winning the AHS High Point Junior Horse in 1999.

In 2002 BREAKIN HEARTS was purchased by the Huber family and was exported to New Zealand. Because of her outstanding results in New Zealand, she is considered responsible for the beginning of an industry exporting trained performance horses to New Zealand that has generated hundreds of thousands of dollars for the Australian Quarter Horse community. Highlights of her time in New Zealand include: 2003 - AQHA-NZ National High Point Youth Horse, AQHA-NZ National High Point Senior Performance Horse, New Zealand Horse of the Year Hi Point Performance Horse: 2004 New Zealand Horse of the Year Hi Point Performance Horse.

In 2004 Leonie Huber imported her back to Australia. Leonie showed her with Reining Australia from 2005 to 2007 and did not show AQHA again while owned by Leonie. Wins include 2005 QRHA State Rookie Champion, 2006 NSW RHA State Show Intermediate Open Reserve Champion and 2007 VRHA Autumn Show Open Reserve Champion. Breakin Hearts won \$1695.81 in 18 Australian Reining shows.

In December, 2007 BREAKIN HEARTS was sold to Kodi Anderson and over the next four years was shown extensively throughout Western Australia, NSW, South Australia and Victoria. In 2010 BREAKIN HEARTS competed at her only Tasmanian Show, winning seven out of seven open classes and was named Hi Point Horse of the show.



BREAKIN HEARTS appears to be the first Australian bred Quarter Horse to win at an American World Show and the first Australian bred Quarter Horse to final at an AmQHA World Show. From 2007 onwards BREAKIN HEARTS was exclusively trained by Kodi Anderson, a youth, then Amateur, which highlights BREAKIN HEARTS extraordinary talent, as this is virtually unheard of showing at AmQHA level in the USA.

BREAKIN HEARTS has won titles in nine different Associations in three different countries - Australia, New Zealand and USA: AQHA Australia, NPHA, Reining Australia, AQHA-NZ, New Zealand Western Riding Federation, NSBA, AmQHA , American Stock Horse Association and Western Horseman (SHOT) Stock Horse Association.

She has more than 2500 lifetime combined AQHA, AmQHA and AQHA-NZ Points. She has 34 National Championships and seven Reserve National Championships in the three countries. BREAKIN HEARTS has placed (top three) in 120 classes at State or Regional Level. Placed (top three) 82 times at the other major Australian shows (NPHA , AHS, Summer Sizzler) She has earned 88 awards in the three AQHA Associations; won four World titles, two Reserve World titles; one World Cup and two Reserve World Cup placing's. Taken Kodi to multiple Hi point wins, Hi Point Youth of Australia 15-18 years twice, over-all Hi Point Youth of Australia and helped take Kodi's College, North Central Texas College, to World Champion Collegiate Stock Horse Team beating the biggest Equestrian Colleges in the USA.

Bill Kaven, Instructor Equine Science and Equestrian Team Head Coach at North Central Texas College, Gainesville, Texas stated that BREAKIN HEARTS exemplifies all the characteristics of what a versatile Quarter Horse should be. She has shown herself to be highly competitive in the four event format of reining, ranch trail, ranch pleasure and cow horse by winning numerous National and World Champion awards at the events she attended. Outside the stock horse events, she has shown herself to be just as competitive in AmQHA approved events she attended.
